Monograph/Book

Go to the library catalogue. Under KEYWORD search "calvin" Refine your search ...somehow. E.g. "calvin? theolog?" See also the library's collection of Electronic Books. Search under "calvin." OR try google books.

Article

Go to the library webpage. Under electronic sources, chose Ebsco. Select [ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials](#). Search under "calvin" OR refine this search....somehow. e.g. "Calvin election" or "Calvin institutes." Make sure you find an ARTICLE not a book review.

Go to the library webpage. Under electronic sources, chose Ebsco. Select **ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials**. Search under "luther ninety-five" OR "luther indulgences"

Works by Arminius are in full-text online at *Christian Classics Ethereal Library* <http://www.ccel.org/> Read anything to do with grace, election, justification – mostly in Book 2. OR do a google search "five articles remonstrance" Make sure you are looking at a site with the text and not a discussion of the text.

Monograph/Book

Go to the library catalogue. Under KEYWORD search" Refine your search ...somehow. E.g. "Arminius" or "armini?" (Nothing under "remonstrance" or "remonstrants.") See also the library's collection of Electronic Books under Electronic Sources. Search under "arminius" or "remonstrants" (not effective under "remonstrance") No, *Dracula* by Bram Stoker won't be a good source! Try google books under "five articles remonstrance."

Article

Go to the library webpage. Under electronic sources, chose Ebsco. Select [ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials](#). Search under "remonstrance" (only 2 FT articles) OR "remonstrants" OR "Arminius."
